2. GIPPSLAND PORTS

Gippsland Ports is a Committee of Management with responsibilities delegated from the Victorian Government's Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources to deliver services and manage assets and infrastructure.

Services include:

- management of port and waterway safety and environmental values,
- provision and management of berths and moorings,
- installation and maintenance of Aids to Navigation,
- hydrographic survey and provision of information to mariners
- maritime security management,
- dredging and channel management
- property management
- on-water fuel retailing,
- vessel repair and maintenance services through two boatyards
- marine pollution response
- marine events oversight
- a range of unspecified community service obligations,



• governance and administrative functions associated with a regional business with 55+ employees and annual turnover in excess of \$10m.

Major assets under GP management include:

- 800+ Aids to Navigation,
- 100+ wharves and jetties,
- 900+ berths and moorings, marine plant and equipment, property, seawalls and boardwalks.
- A Cutter Suction Dredge, "Kalimna" combined with a floating booster pump, comprehensive delivery pipe network, sand transfer station and two ocean outfalls
- A new build 650 m3 Trailing Suction Hopper Dredge, "Tommy Norton"

Gippsland Ports currently operates from 4 sites, Bairnsdale, Lakes Entrance, Paynesville and Port Welshpool and has responsibility for 5 of Victoria's 14 Local Ports and 2 Declared Waterways that comprise 1400m2 of waterways located along the Victorian coast from Inverloch to Mallacoota.

Principal activities within and from the Ports and Waterways under Gippsland Ports' management include recreational boating, commercial charter vessel operations, Victoria's largest commercial fishing fleet, oil and gas industry services and coastal commercial shipping.

3. POSITION IN CONTEXT

The Master – TSHD "Tommy Norton" position requires a suitably qualified and experienced person to operate Gippsland Ports' principal dredging asset, "Tommy Norton" which will be based at Lakes Entrance, Port of Gippsland Lakes.

"Tommy Norton" will be delivered to Gippsland Ports by the builder, Damen Shipyards Group not later than October 2017.

The vessel is a Damen 650 Trailing Suction Hopper Dredge, customised specifically for the operational requirements for maintenance of ocean access to the Port of Gippsland Lakes.

"Tommy Norton is 60.04m LOA, powered by twin Caterpillar C18 447kw propulsion engines driving through two fixed pitch azimuth thrusters with nozzle, complemented by a Caterpillar C12 powered, 245kw three channel bow thruster.

"Tommy Norton" is equipped with contemporary operating and navigation systems and is designed to be highly manoeuvrable and versatile, including "rainbowing" and pump ashore capability.

The operating focus and arrangements will primarily be at Lakes Entrance, and generally operating daylight hours, Monday to Friday in accordance with the terms and conditions of Gippsland Ports Enterprise Agreement.

The Master will:

- Lead and manage the safe, efficient and effective operation and maintenance of "Tommy Norton" and associated vessels, plant and equipment, as a member of the Maritime Services team and in support of Gippsland Ports dredging program.
- Provide leadership and direction to "Tommy Norton" crew.
- Be accountable under all applicable regulatory and statutory regimes for the safe operation of "Tommy Norton" and ancillary equipment whilst in command of the vessel.
- Be accountable for work performance of "Tommy Norton" crew whilst in command of the vessel.



- Be accountable for compliance with all environmental statutes and regulatory regimes and permit conditions associated with the operation of "Tommy Norton" and ancillary equipment.
- Ensure and be accountable for planned maintenance, periodic maintenance and routine maintenance of "Tommy Norton" and ancillary equipment.
- Ensure and be accountable for maintenance of detailed records of operations, maintenance, spares and stores, fuels and lubricants, productivity and performance of the "Tommy Norton"
- Subject to being suitably qualified, alternately serve as Engineer of "Tommy Norton"
- Prepare and provide regular and periodic reports to Gippsland Ports Management and other agencies as and when required.

• SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The position may require travel between Gippsland Ports' facilities throughout its region and to other locations, including Melbourne.

The incumbent will be required to work at heights and within confined spaces and may require exposure to hazardous conditions, material or equipment.

- Specific qualifications with relevant work experience
- Dredging related experience
- Leadership of dredging related vessel operation and maintenance practices
- Ability to work effectively and collaboratively within a team environment.
- Vessel specific operational training and knowledge.
- Ability to lead and work effectively within a team environment.
- Physical ability to carry out tasks of the position, including ability to swim (a pre-employment medical will be required).



8. ENVIRONMENT HEALTH & SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

All employees will assist the Manager of their work unit to create and maintain a safe and healthy work environment by working safely, adhering to instructions and using the equipment provided in accordance with safe operating procedures.

- Read, understand and comply with all Gippsland Ports' policies and procedures.
